TEACHER LED

- Digital program available through the JA Campus.
- Teacher registration on the JA Campus required.
- Access Code to the program provided by the JA Program Manager.
- Teacher delivers program to their class using the materials provided by JA Manitoba.

STUDENT SELF-DIRECTED

- Student registration required on the JA Campus.
- Students complete digital program at their own pace.
- Progress can be teacher monitored.
